Presbyterian Church of Ireland. Then I heard the statistic that Agnes Street Presbyterian four blocks away, sent 545 men to fight in World War I. 72 died. This prompted an interest in the history of Crumlin Road Presbyterian. Our church was blitzed in 1941 and burned to the ground including all records. How many men did we send to World War I? A worthy project to pursue, along with the Stothers genealogy!
