He was serving in Guatemala when he saw various well-qualified missionaries had to leave the field because their ministry focus changed and they no longer had a mission agency. God called him to join missionaries to help them do what He called them to do. CTEN has helped over 300 missionaries. David gave us a week of volunteer time. He especially helped me, as my group was all boys, and he interrupted his work to accompany them to toilet many times. David has worked at the Vine Center for three years funded to do reconciliation work with the community youth, but that money has dried up as agencies are saying the Troubles are over. So now free from "chasing the funding" his heart wants to do pastoral support work for all ages. Like us he is a mature person with grown children, a mortgage half paid up, and with lots of spiritual life experiences to share. He was a Belfast City Mission (BCM)



missionary pastor for 15 years. Based in the Vine Center he can help people who would not go into a church and he can support all the churches in the Greater Shankill area referring people where they might fit in. When David told us he was "faith based" and with trepidation was starting his fundraising, I immediately said, we are willing to give you £20 (\$40) a month and some of our supporters

may help. He is praying for 45 people willing to give £25 a month. Many of you will recognize the strategic value of supporting a "native" worker. So here's the deal, if any of you are willing to commit to \$5 or 10 a month more, we together can be one of the 45 people that David needs. If you or your church would like to fund a native Irish pastoral support worker they can commit to \$600 annually and we will pass it on to the Vine Center for David's support.
